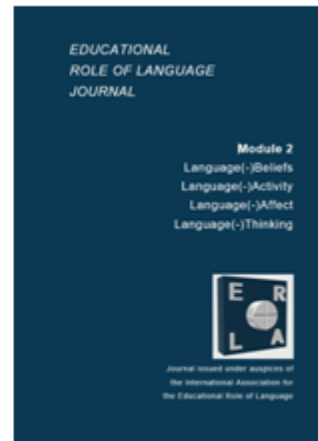

### Confidentiality



### GENERAL RULES

ERL Journal follows the recommendations of *COPE Ethical Guidelines for Peer Review*. Therefore, reviewers understand their responsibilities related to confidentiality of the process; that is, reviewers shall “refrain from using information obtained during the peer-review process for their own or another’s advantage, or to disadvantage or discredit others”. Likewise, they will not involve anyone else in the review process without the explicit permission from the journal.

### PEER-REVIEW PROCESS

ERL Journal follows a strict selection policy. All contributions will be initially assessed by the editor for suitability for the journal. Papers deemed suitable will then undergo a double-blind, peer-review process carried out by members of the Board of Reviewers and by selected experts. Therefore, during the review process, editors mediate all interactions between reviewers and authors. As COPE recommends, a list of the names of any individuals who have helped with the review will be published in the official site of the journal to recognise their efforts.

### ENSURING BLIND REVIEW

Authors are responsible for removing any information from their manuscripts (including footnotes and acknowledgments) that might reveal their identities or affiliations. Therefore, authors must:

- a) Create two separate files: one including an Author-Identifying Title Page, which should clearly state it is not for review; and the main manuscript without identifying information.
- b) Remove metadata (author, company, manager and saved by) stored in ‘file properties’ of electronic files. They must remove hidden information as well, which may include hidden text, revised text, comments or field codes. - c) In the text, to maintain the integrity of the review process, authors must replace any information that would identify them, such as names, locations or university affiliations, awards or grants received.
